

### VOTE PROTECTORS NEEDED FOR 2022 ELECTIONS

From our friends at Democracy North Carolina comes an invitation to join in the work of protecting free and fair elections in our state:

"Ever-changing election law and the continuing pandemic pose unique challenges to voters. Democracy North Carolina's nonpartisan Voter Protection program works to ensure that every voter can successfully cast their ballot. Our volunteer Vote Protectors are the "eyes and ears on the ground" at voting sites across NC. They help voters who encounter problems at the polls and ensure that every polling place is running as it should - sounding the alarm when something isn't right. In short, Vote Protectors save votes.

For the 2022 spring primary, Vote Protectors will be deployed on the last day of Early Voting (Saturday, May 14th) and on Election Day (Tuesday, May 17th).

Don't worry, we'll teach you everything you need to know at this training, and connect you to our live voter hotline to help you answer voter questions. You can sign up for any training that works for your schedule, regardless if you live in that region.

Your presence as a Vote Protector can make a real difference. Our Vote Protectors serve to calm the atmosphere for voters. The heated partisan environment around voting can be intimidating and even inhibitory, and your ability to show up as a nonpartisan helper will go a long way."

### REDISTRICTING ACTION MOVES BACK TO COURTS

Now that the Republican-dominated legislature has adopted new maps for state and Congressional districts, the maps will go for review, first to a 3 judge panel created by the state Supreme Court; the judges may uphold the new maps, uphold instead maps submitted by the original case's plaintiffs, or ask a small panel to create maps in place of both.
